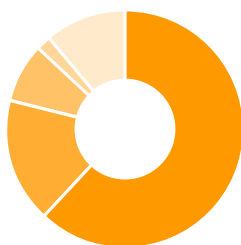

Rank in class is computed each semester based on all courses. GPA and class rank are not cumulative. Grades for the class of 2022 are not weighted.

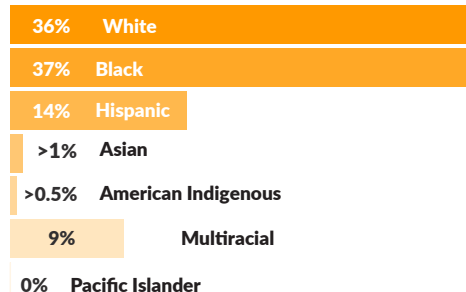

CURRICULUM

A wide variety of courses in academics and career technical education is offered to meet the needs of all students.

Academic classes include: Social Studies and World Languages (Spanish, French, German, and Chinese); Honors classes in English, Math, Science; Advanced classes in English and Math; and Advanced Placement courses in Calculus, Statistics, English, World History, Government, Microeconomics, U.S. History, Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Science and Physics. AP and Honors are open-enrollment programs. Dual credit is available in English, U.S. History, Pre-Calculus, Spanish, Economics and Government.

ATHLETICS

Clay High School offers a wide selection of IHSAA sanctioned athletic activities and several club sports. The Clay High School athletic teams strive for excellence every day on and off the athletic fields while we continue to honor and promote our proud Clay High School past. The Clay High Athletic Department is committed to providing an atmosphere for the development of well-rounded individuals. High morals and good sportsmanship are the standard expectations for the athletic department. Clay High School is a member of the Northern Indiana Conference (NIC) and is governed by the rules and regulations of the Indiana High School Athletic Association (IHSAA).

VISUAL & PERFORMING ARTS MAGNET

Clay's specialized program in Visual & Performing Arts offers a much deeper arts curriculum and greatly expanded arts activities in music, art, drama, and dance. Clay is the only SBCSC high school to offer a full dance program, including multiple levels in modern, ballet, jazz, ethnic/folk dance, and choreography.

Music has multiple levels in band, orchestra, and choral programs as well as piano keyboarding and music theory. Students may elect to take private lessons during the school day, at their own cost.

The Drama Department offers a full theater curriculum and presents four extracurricular productions (2 plays and 2 musicals) each year. Clay is also honored to host the Summerfly Theater program.

Visual Arts has many individual disciplines, including painting, sculpture, photography, jewelry, printmaking, ceramics, and graphic arts.
